

## Geological Society of Connecticut

Steering Committee Meeting January 11, 2010, Hartford Marriott Rocky Hill, CT

**Call to order:** The meeting was called to order by Janet Stone at 4:45pm **Attendees:** Janet Stone; Randy Steinen; Gail Batchelder; Peter LeTourneau; Mark Lewis; Margaret Thomas; Mike Wizevich

Guest: John Purtill, Community Accounting Aid and Services, Inc. (CAAS)

John Purtill, CPA presented issues associated with a non-profit status for the Society. John interviewed the group relative to the Society mission and goals, and mode of operation. The Society must be a 'non stock' corporation to achieve non-profit status. The CAAS can assist the society with developing incorporating documents and preparation of tax returns. The business plan/constitution and bylaws should include information about our events, financial goals, educational mission, scholarships, and publications as applicable. <a href="www.guidestar.com">www.guidestar.com</a> has information on filling out the required 990 tax document for the IRS in order to qualify as an Educational 501c3 non-profit organization. <a href="www.purtill.com">www.purtill.com</a> has a checklist of items needed for non-profit status. Legalzoom.com will prepare and file the required corporate filing documents for a fee. <a href="www.probonopartner.org">www.probonopartner.org</a> may be a good resource for legal services, as attorneys at larger firms must provide 3% of their billable hours pro bono (for public good - no fee).

The Society has 1.5 years (27months) to get organized as a non-profit. Within that time frame, the Society must apply to the IRS by filing form 1023. Upon review, the IRS will give tentative approval, valid for 5 years. After the 5 year period, the IRS will evaluate the status of the Society to ensure we are still operating as a non-profit.

Required documents: bylaws; organizational objectives (constitution); business plan. We should complete form 1023 in the next couple of months. We already have a Tax ID#; Any changes to our Charter must be sent to the Secretary of State. Our fiscal year will be July 1 – June 30<sup>th</sup>.

We must file for 990 for 2009, which will be yr 1 or our 5 yr tentative approval. John Purtill will send in a form 990EZ on our behalf, and provide us with a free copy of Quick Books software to ease data exchange between the Society and CAAS.

Action items: Peter will submit application form to CAAS.

Mike will draft bylaws for review with a goal of accepting them at the next meeting.

Gail will draft 1023 form for committee review at the next meeting.

Gail will send out a press release to Earth; GSA;DEP and other relevant state associations using our new domain <a href="https://www.geologicalsocietyofconnecticut.org">www.geologicalsocietyofconnecticut.org</a>

Matte will register the alternate domain: connecticutgeologicalsociety.org

Gail will check on web traffic program and potential fees.

Janet suggested Peter coordinate the Mesozoic quarry field trip for the spring. There was discussion about the possibility of 4 stops, including Suzio and Portland Quarries, Mesozoic fractures, and lake cycles. Wesleyan and Dino Pk were mentioned as possible hosts for the meeting. A Field Trip Subcommittee consisting of Peter, Mike, and Janet will report back at the Feb meeting.

## Motions:

There was a motion to accept the November <u>Meeting Minutes</u> as modified. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

There was a motion to accept the <u>Treasurer's Report</u> as presented. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

There was a motion to grant <u>John Purtill membership in the Society in gratitude for his professional services</u>. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.
